



Bell ringing can be mastered by most people. With training and practice the learner can move on to ringing with the rest of the band (team).






CHANGE RINGING

Change ringing originated in the sixteenth century when church bells began to be hung with a full wheel. This gave ringers control of the bell allowing sets of bells (rings) to be rung in a continuously changing pattern – hence, change ringing.

Bells are hung to create a musical scale. A method is a pre-defined sequence of changes within the musical scale.

Visiting ringers will be welcomed in towers around the world. Learning basic methods will make the visit more enjoyable, offering the possibility of ringing with the local band on practice night or for church services.
