HUGUENOT COMMEMORATION

On Sunday 20th October the Annual Huguenot Commemoration Evensong took place in the Cathedral where the community worshipped from 1665 until 1816.

The service was sung by the Dean's Vicar, the Schola and the Gentlemen and included the specially written Huguenot anthem, with words by the Dean's Vicar, Canon Mullen, and music by the Organist and Assistant Master of the Music, Mr David Leigh. The lessons were read by Dr Marie Léoutre of the Huguenot Society and (in French) by M Lionel Paradisi-Coulouma, Deputy Head of Mission at the Embassy of France. The occasional prayers were led as always by Revd Fr Conor Harpur, SJ, Chaplain to the Irish Section.

This year being the 300th anniversary of the death of Élie Bouhéreau, Huguenot refugee and first Keeper of Marsh's Library (and buried in the Lady Chapel), it was fitting that the address was given by the present director of the Library, Dr Jason McElligott.

Following the service, with typical generosity, the Dean and Mrs Morton hosted a reception in the deanery for members of the Huguenot Society. At this, the acting chair of the Irish Section, Mr Martin Bernon, thanked the dean for his welcome and hospitality and spoke movingly about the late Dr John Maiben Gilmartin, former chair who died in July this year.

THE ROOF PROJECT

The erection of scaffolding to facilitate the roof repairs continues through the autumn. Thanks to the detailed planning that has taken place over the last two years few problems have yet emerged. Almost all of the clerestory windows in the nave have now been removed. You will see from inside the Cathedral the bracing across the windowsills that tie the scaffold to the building and so facilitate the creation of the temporary roof which will become important once the old slates are stripped away and removed.

With the exception of that above the choir and crossing, the vaulted ceiling is constructed of lath and plaster and so is especially vulnerable to water damage. Significant water ingress would close the Cathedral.

Over the coming weeks we will increase the amount of messaging on the scaffolding in an effort to let worshippers and visitors know they continue to be welcome throughout the repairs and, in the case of visitors, that their visit will support the ongoing conservation of our Cathedral.

We continue to be humbled by the financial contribution that so many have made, and continue to make, towards this vital project. Hardly a day goes by without significant donations arriving, for which we are very grateful. It is easy for us working here to forget that this Cathedral church means so much to so many people. These contributions allow us to protect the Cathedral and remind us that we are privileged to have such an institution under our care.



NEWS FROM THE CATHEDRAL GRAMMAR SCHOOL

The first half of the Autumn term at the Grammar School has been very busy. In terms of numbers the school is now bigger than ever with 220 pupils. Although it can get a bit crowded at times, the additional numbers have had a very positive impact on the school, particularly when it comes to extracurricular activities. Basketball has become hugely popular this year and the girls' team recently won a number of competitive matches. The boys' rugby team has also played a number of matches this term with great success. A large number of students are now playing chess during lunch on Tuesday afternoons and we are very grateful to the PCPA for sponsoring both junior and senior chess trophies, which will be awarded at the end of the year.

The new Kevin Street Building was included in the IAF Open House event this year and even though we were only open to the public for 3 hours we had over 150 visitors during that time. Edwin Scally of Quilligan Scally architects gave a talk about the history of the project to each group before they were taken on a tour of the building. Quite a number of past pupils took the opportunity to visit, including several who were in the school when the project was first mooted in the last century!

This is our second year in the Kevin Street Building. We are all still enjoying it and very much looking forward to the installation of three stained glass windows in the western elevation of the building. The work will be completed by the artist James Earley. His design concept is based on the themes of past, present and future along with primary, secondary and tertiary education. The piece will also reflect the close relationship between the Grammar School and the Cathedral. The choice of colours and textures in the piece was strongly i influenced by the stained glass windows in the Lady Chapel. We hope to have the windows installed before Christmas. In addition to the stained glass windows James will also paint a mural on the north facing wall of the Packenham Hall which will really brighten up that area of the school.

The school orchestra now has over 30 members, 10 of whom are currently in first year. The orchestra rehearses every Thursday and were recently invited to perform at the Post Primary Music Teachers Association annual conference. A room full of music teachers can be a tough crowd for a school orchestra but our students received a standing ovation at the end of their performance!

Our Transition Year students are just back from their annual trip to Killary adventure centre and are now busy rehearsing for this years' musical, Aladdin, which takes place at the end of November after we return from the half-term break.



THE GAUDETE SINGERS

The Gaudete Singers, directed by the Cathedral's Organist, David Leigh, will present a concert featuring German music of the Renaissance and baroque eras by Isaac, Praetorius, Schütz and Pachelbel, but focused primarily on four motets by Johann Sebastian Bach. This will be given in the Cathedral's Lady Chapel on Sunday 10 November, beginning at 8.00 pm. The continuo parts will be played by Tristan Russcher, one of the Cathedral's distinguished former organ scholars, who will also allow the singers some respite by playing appropriate solo pieces.

There will be a charge of $\pounds 20$ (concessions $\pounds 15$; students with valid student ID $\pounds 5$) for admission to help cover the concert's costs. Those present will be offered a glass of wine after the concert.

This is the eighteenth year in which the Gaudete Singers have given a concert of sacred music in the Cathedral, usually in late November or early December. Readers may recall, for instance, the 2004 programme consisting of sixteenth-century Scottish polyphony and featuring Robert Carver's *Missa L'Homme Armé*, or the 2005 one entitled "*From Tallis to Britten*", or the 2007 diet of "*Palestrina and Pärt Interleaved*". But these singers have a more varied repertoire: within the last few years, for instance, they have performed *Jaanilaulud* by the Estonian composer Veljo Tormis, Morten Lauridsen's *Madrigali: Six "Fire Songs*" on Italian Renaissance Poems, and the prize-winning *Mother Goose Rhymes* by Eoghan Desmond, a vicar choral in the Cathedral choir. The Gaudete Singers have appeared as guest artists at two Roaring Twenties festivals in Killarney, and have sung in many languages, including Irish, French, German, Italian, Spanish, Catalan, Portuguese, Czech, Hungarian, Russian,

Polish and Nahuatl. But English, Latin (in pronunciations varying with the provenance of the compositions) and sacred music composed between the fifteenth century and the twenty-first account for more than half of their energies.
