VICTORIA GREEN



Born in Essex, Victoria studied with George Zarb before gaining a place at Trinity College of Music, London to train under Roland Gallery. While at College she participated in numerous masterclasses with guitarists including

David Russell, Leo Brouwer and Nikita Koshkin, as well as gaining 2nd place in the Ivor Mairants International Guitar Award. She has a busy and varied career and is much in demand as both a solo and chamber music performer having given recitals at venues including the Cathedrals of Peterborough, Birmingham & Edinburgh, the latter as part of the Fringe Festival. As a soloist Victoria has given numerous concerto performances including Rodrigo's *Concierto de Aranjuez* accompanied by members of the BBC Symphony and Royal Philharmonic Orchestras. Victoria was also featured on a recording of the choristers of Saint Edward's Romford 'In Dulci Jubilo' and twice with the choristers of Saint Patrick's Cathedral, Dublin on their CD 'In Dublin's fair city' and their latest disc 'May the road rise to meet you' performing a number of new arrangements for treble voices and guitar as well as appearing on recordings of the chamber music of Roderick Elms performing specially composed pieces for Guitar and Organ.

STUART NICHOLSON



Stuart Nicholson studied at the Royal College of Music in London with John Birch, during which time he was awarded scholarships at the Temple Church and Saint Paul's Cathedral; he became an

Associate of the Royal College of Music in organ performance with honours and graduated with a first class honours in July 1997 and a postgraduate oboe prize – the latter by accident!

After graduating, Stuart spent 6 months as acting assistant organist of Saint Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh followed by appointments at Waltham Abbey, Essex and Birmingham Cathedral. In 2010, Stuart was appointed Organist & Master of the Music at Saint Patrick's Cathedral. The Cathedral Choir maintains a far busier schedule than most of their UK counterparts which includes 12 weekly choral services, frequent broadcasts, concerts, tours & recordings.

A keen arranger, Stuart has had many of his arrangements published by Novellos and performed by groups including the BBC Singers, the Bach Choir & the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra.

He lives in Dublin with wife Victoria and their 2-year-old daughter Charlotte who certainly has the cheekiness to join her father in the choir stalls before too long!
