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1. Our Service

Saint Patrick's Cathedral, at Saint Patrick's Close, Dublin 8, is the National Cathedral of the Church of Ireland, a member church of the Anglican Communion. We provide religious, educational, musical, and recreational activities and services to children on a daily basis through a range of local services.

We work under the guidance of the Church of Ireland's national safeguarding policy – *Safeguarding Trust: The Church of Ireland Code of Good Practice for Ministry with Children* – and its associated procedures.

Services and activities delivered to children throughout Saint Patrick's Cathedral include:

- Religious ministry.
- Chorister programme, which includes off-site activities, domestic and international tours, and collaboration with Saint Patrick's Cathedral Choir School (Roll Number: 19480V).
- Bell ringing for school-age students.
- Peripatetic music tuition, including one-to-one teaching.
- Educational activities with schools, clubs, and community groups within the Cathedral and its environs.
- Community events on- and off-site.
- Community outreach initiatives.
- Family and tourist visits to the cathedral.

2. Our Principles to Safeguard Children from Harm

- The safety and welfare of children is everyone's responsibility.
- The best interests of the child must be paramount in all decisions made by Saint Patrick's Cathedral staff.
- It is our duty to safeguard all children, regardless of gender, sexual orientation, religion, age, ability, race, or ethnicity, by providing safe and structured child-centred services and activities,
- Children have a right to dignity and respect.
- Young people have a right to be heard, listened to, and taken seriously. Taking account of their age and understanding, they should be consulted and involved in all matters and decisions that may affect their lives.
- Parents/carers have a right to respect and should be consulted and involved in matters concerning their children. We respect that right, properly balanced with the need to safeguard children from harm¹.
- Child safeguarding requires multi-agency, multi-disciplinary cooperation. We will work with Tusla, An Garda Síochána, and other agencies and professionals in the best interests of children and young people.
