

THE DEAN WRITES...

THE VERY REVD DR WILLIAM MORTON

cavalcade of official limousines arrived at Saint Patrick's Cathedral for the top security visit of His Excellency the President of Italy, Sergio Mattarella. Accompanying the President was de facto the First Lady, his daughter Laura. The delegation also included the Italian Ambassador to Ireland, H.E. Ruggero Corrias, the Irish Ambassador to Italy, H.E. Patricia O'Brien, the Chief of Protocol, Department of Foreign Affairs, Mr Paul Kavanagh, and several others from The Department of Foreign Affairs.


The Dean and Ordinary, Dr William Morton, received and welcomed President Mattarella in a few sentences in Italian before introducing him to Mr Louis Parminter, Cathedral Manager and Dean's Verger, and to Mr Gavan Woods, Administrator. Mr Parminter then brought the President and the members of the delegation on a guided tour, mentioning key points in the history of the Cathedral, the benevolence of Sir. Benjamin Lee Guinness in the 19th century restoration, the development of the musical and choral tradition, the development of the Choir School, the use for worship of the Lady Chapel by the Huguenots for 160 years, and many other aspects as well culminating with reference to Dean Jonathan Swift and his famous self-composed epitaph. Following this, President Mattarella was invited by Dean Morton to sign the Visitors' Book.

President Mattarella – through an interpreter – said he considered the Cathedral to be 'enthralling' and 'absolutely fascinating.' He greatly enjoyed learning how the Cathedral has developed through the centuries, reflecting the course which Irish history has taken. The President said he dearly wished he had more time 'to stand in front of every memorial, learn about its history, and absorb the wonderful ambience of such a magnificent cathedral.'

In welcoming the visit of the President of Italy, the Dean said he regards it as very positive and significant that Saint Patrick's Cathedral should be included in the itinerary of the visit, illustrating the degree to which the Cathedral is prominently established in the religious, historical, cultural, and artistic trail in Dublin and further afield. Dr Morton was delighted that the President and his party had richly enjoyed their visit. WWM

THE ADMINISTRATOR WRITES...

his week. invited five we contractors tender for to the Community Mews and Education Centre project. This is a substantial undertaking involving the complete refurbishment of a dilapidated stable block, reordering the yard to the east of the building, and new access through the Deanery garden.

A major challenge is the tightness of the site. Access will be difficult for large commercial vehicles, materials, and equipment. Added to this is the complicating factor that the work must take place within a largely domestic complex of buildings adjoining the Grammer School. Nonetheless, we are confident that we can get it done with the right contractor and the skill and experience of our architects, Howley Hayes Cooney, and our project managers, Interactive Project Management.


We estimate that the project will take up to a year to complete. Considerable disruption will occur during the works,

which must be managed. Nonetheless, in this case, the end justifies the means. The completed project will bring a building back into meaningful use and transform a neglected part of the Deanery curtilage.

The top floor of the Mews will contain state-of-the-art individual music tuition rooms for our choristers and a classroom fitted with the technology required to facilitate modern teaching. Downstairs we will create a large single space, capable of accommodating up to seventy seated persons, again with all modern IT infrastructure installed to allow for maximum flexibility of use. There will be a small kitchenette within the building and an external covered space leading to a separate services block adjacent to the main Mews building.

The Mews will allow us to accommodate a wide array of community, church, and education groups that we struggle to welcome today, given our lack of suitable spaces and the increased business of the Cathedral. *GHW*

NEW DIGITAL ORGAN



Thanks to the generosity of the Friends of Saint Patrick's Cathedral, we recently acquired a second-hand digital organ for the Hewson Room.

It has only been in its new home for a matter of weeks, but it is already in daily use as a secondary teaching and practice instrument when the Cathedral's wonderful Willis – or the Cathedral itself – is otherwise busy.

We have several choristers – former and serving – who have taken up the organ having reached a suitable level of proficiency on the piano first, and we hope this will further encourage more to follow in their footsteps.

DEAN'S GIFT DAY APPEAL

Appeal is strongly related to worship, in fact at its very heart – the magnificent Willis organ, the Wondrous Machine. Together with our choirs, it is the heartbeat of our liturgical life, forms part of our identity, our reputation as a centre of excellence for musical and choral tradition, and into the bargain is a world-class instrument.

The reality is that over and above the annual budget of maintenance, tuning, and routine repairs (for which the Board allows in the annual budget), the organ requires a new console, pedal board, and bench.

It's a bit analogous to how a vintage car has to receive constant attention and maintenance; the organ, whilst a musical instrument, is also a complex machine with very many moving parts, and many of them date from its installation in 1902 and are therefore over 120 years old, and many other components were new in the restoration of 1963 and are still working.

This is precisely why the organ requires more major work in certain areas. Since the late 1990s, the organ has been in the excellent care of organ builder from County Kildare, Trevor Crowe, who has been responsible for maintaining the instrument, and for many improvements in enhancing sound quality, rendering the organ the most important romantic instrument in Ireland, and attracting international attention.

welcome to Saint Patrick's for Evensong recently Archbishop Hosam Naoum of Jerusalem and his clergy, who were spending a few days on retreat with Archbishop Michael Jackson and some of his clergy from Dublin & Glendalough. Dean Morton assured Archbishop Naoum, and the clergy and the people of his diocese of our prayers for a just and lasting peace in the countries of our Lord's earthly home. The Diocese of Jerusalem includes Gaza and the West Bank.

In the run-up to Easter we were delighted to make a major donation of €20,000, as part of our charitable giving from money donated at the candlestands in the Cathedral, to the Appeal of The Dioceses of Dublin & Glendalough for the Diocese of Jerusalem: *Shine A Light* for Al Ahli Hospital in Gaza which strives

to treat the wounded, and console the dying, at the heart of this humanitarian crisis on a world scale. Valuable links have been established over several years between The Diocese of Jerusalem and The Dioceses of Dublin & Glendalough, and it is the hope of the Archbishop of Dublin that the appeal will reach a target of €250,000.
